Plans for a Multi-use trail in Greenbrier Park!!!

The City is planning to build a multi-use, 8-foot wide gravel trail in Greenbrier Park that will run from Brandywine Drive downstream towards the railroad. This trail will have a series of bridges and boardwalks to cross over the streams and wetlands. It will also have improved views of the creek.

Eventually, the trail will be extended upstream to connect to the City's Meadow Creek Valley Park, which is situated behind the houses that front onto Brandywine Drive and the Seminole Square Shopping Center. This will allow bike riders and walkers to get from our neighborhood to the Senior Center and head north to Fashion Square Mall. Or, users can follow Meadow Creek south (further upstream) and get to destinations such as Whole Foods, Bodos, and eventually UVA (see map on the other side).

In the other direction (downstream), the Greenbrier Park trail will run through a new tunnel that will be built under the railroad. Just on the other side of the railroad is the existing John Warner Parkway Bike Trail. From here, users will be able to bike to Downtown or head northwards towards Dunlora and Belvedere.

All in all, the Greenbrier Park trail is the starting point for an amazing set of trails that will serve our neighborhood for years to come! To learn more about this trail network, attend the GNA Fall Meeting on September 15.

McIntire Botanical Garden , is aiming to redevelop the eastern half of McIntire East Park in 2018. A landscape architect hired by the City has recently completed final construction plans for this part of the park.

CITY COUNCIL TAKES UP DEER CONTROL PROGRAM

At its July 18th meeting, the City Council received a report from David Kucka, an official with the Virginia Department of Game and Inland Fisheries, on the City's options for addressing the deer population in the City. Mr. Kucka spoke at length about what he considered the most effective method for controlling the deer population, hunting. He suggested the City consider establishing an urban archery season within the City limits, which would allow residents to either hunt deer, with bow and arrow, on their own property or allow others to do so. Around 40 localities in the state of Virginia permit urban archery.

The City Council directed staff to follow up on the communities that have established urban archery and to research other methods for culling deer herds including sterilization. The City of Fairfax is one community that has pursued sterilization to manage its deer population.

The Council will receive a report from the staff and hold a public hearing on its options in mid-September or early October.
